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Summary of Minutes of HECap Board April 30, 2008

The Higher Education Capital Match Program ("HECap) Board met at the New York State Capitol, Room 143 on April 30, 2008 at 11:00 am.

The Meeting was called to order by Ron Rock, Chair. Roll call was taken and a quorum was present. Those Members present and absent for the Meeting were as follows:

Mr. Rock welcomed the members of the HECap Board and guests. He noted that the Dormitory Authority serves as staff to the HECap Board. He introduced Debra Pulenskey Drescher, Esq., Managing General Counsel of the Dormitory Authority of the State of New York, to outline the status of projects to date. Ms. Drescher noted the projects that were ready for Board approval and also stated that some of the other projects were not ready to be presented to the Board because they had not yet met all of the requirements of the statute (i.e. - sufficient resources not provided, environmental review not completed, unresolved site control issues, clarification of the project and projects that were requesting waivers). Mr. Rock noted that he and the other Board Members would work with staff to finalize the waiver process and requests.

Mr. Jacoppi inquired if the project approvals could be posted to the Dormitory Authority website. Ms. Drescher responded in the affirmative. She indicated that the Dormitory Authority could begin working immediately to have the contracts with the colleges and universities executed and with the New York State Office of the State Comptroller to have the schools reimbursed as quickly as possible.

Mr. Rock then proceeded to present the following Resolutions to be acted upon by the Board:

First Resolution authorizing Mr. Jack D. Homkow, Director of Environmental Affairs for the Dormitory Authority, as staff to the HECap Board, to undertake certain responsibilities as are necessary

for complying under the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA"). A Motion was made by Mr. Jacoppi, seconded by Assemblywoman Glick. All voted in favor.

The Second Resolution adopting the determinations made under SEQRA for the projects under consideration by the HECap Board was advanced by Assemblywoman Glick, seconded by Mr. Jacoppi and all voted in favor.

The final Resolution approving certain projects and allowing the Dormitory Authority to enter into Agreements with the specific higher education institutions was considered. A motion was made by Mr. Jacoppi, seconded by Assemblywoman Glick and all voted in favor.

Mr. Rock stated that the HECap Board had taken all actions needed to approve the projects submitted by the Dormitory Authority. Meeting was adjourned at 11:20 am.
